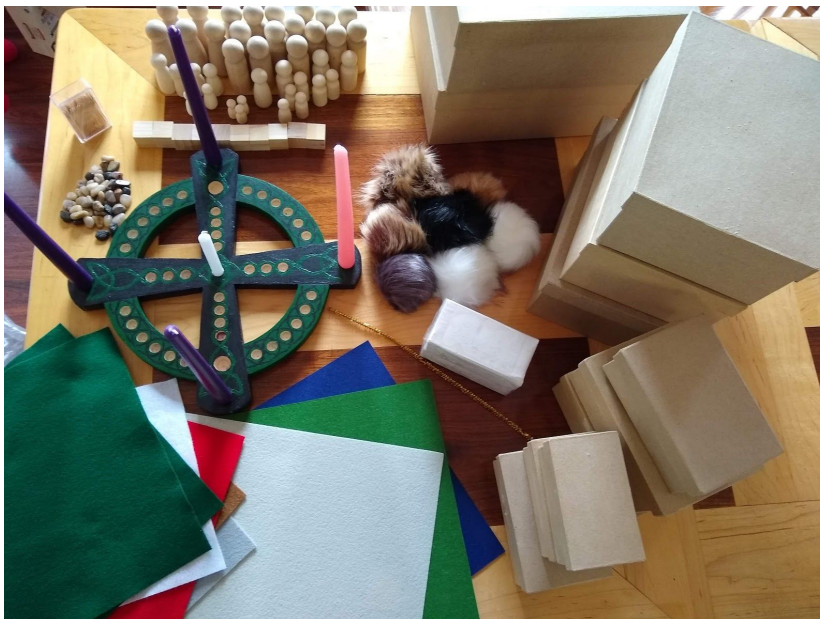


To Tell These Stories You Will Need:

- Advent wreath with 5 candles (3 purple or blue, 1 pink, 1 white)
- Matches or lighter for wreath (matches preferred)
- Paper Mache or Cardboard boxes with lids of various sizes (2 large, 3 medium, about 5 small boxes)
- 20 adult wooden figures (available at a craft store/online as “peg people” or “peg dolls”)
- 3-5 child wooden figures (mini/small “peg people”)
- Felt in several colors: 1 large green, 1-2 medium green, 1 large blue, 1 brown (to make tent), 1 large tan (desert), 1 medium red, 2 white felt robes for angel figures, and 1 (optional) gray
- At least 6 Puff balls in various colors for animals (must have at least a couple white, 3 tan/brown, 1 optional gray or brown)
- Small amount of twine for 2 angel belts
- 1 gold pipe cleaner “crown”
- 1 aluminum foil “armor”
- 1 optional giant wooden figure (we can just put a large adult figure on a box)
- Toothpicks (1 for a spear for Saul and toothpicks to build altar)
- Small wooden cubes
- Small stones/Pebbles
- Small cup and spoon (for Elijah’s altar)
- 2 Evergreen branches (you can make do with 1 if needed)
- Beige clay (for pregnant bellies and Zechariah’s mouth)
- 3 tiny objects (3 tiny boxes) to represent wise men gifts and Abraham’s possessions
- Small sticks to prop up Abraham and Sarah’s tent
- A stack of books or boxes to build a mountain (for the story “Israel Taken to Assyria”)
- A waterproof covering for the mountain of books (like a plastic bag or cutting board)



These materials can be found on Amazon or in craft stores like Hobby Lobby. You can also substitute materials for similar items that you already have around the house (like legos or little people for the peg people).
